

Colored Musicians Gave Great Concert

Delightful Program of Classical and Hawaiian Music at City Hall

There was a goodly attendance on Monday night at the city hall on the occasion of the concert and entertainment held under the auspices of the Colored Musicians Co. This is a local organization, composed entirely of the members of the colored population of the city, and the programme provided on this occasion was a most creditable one in every respect. It consisted of songs, instrumental, trios, duets, quartettes, and choruses by the entire company, and every number was well rendered and hugely enjoyed. There was plenty of life to the affair, and encores were frequent and graciously responded to. The chair was occupied by Mr. Wm. Miller in his usual happy manner, and kept everybody in rare good humor.

Among those who took part in addition to the company as a whole were Messrs. Scott, Green and Bowie in an instrumental trio; quartette, Woodbeck, Scott, Green and Bowie; violin solo, George Goodbeck (sic); Hawaiian duet, Bowie and Green; quartette Miller, Scott, Johnston, Woodbeck; Hawaiian trio Johnston, Green, Bowie; reading, H. Bowie; instrumental quartette, Woodbeck, Bowie, Scott and Green; Hawaiian solo, W. Johnston; quartette, Miller, Scott, Johnston, Woodbeck; Hawaiian solo, H.W. Bowie; Hawaiian trio, Johnston, Bowie, Green; Hawaiian duet, Bowie Green; solo, J. Green. These various numbers were interspersed with funny jokes and the chairman helped things along by his interjectory remarks. The financial returns were satisfactory.
